District Caucus Rules Report

I. Agenda

- 1. District Caucuses, Saturday, May 11, 2024
 - a. District caucuses shall convene at 1:00 PM in the rooms assigned in the Official Call to Convention. The 2022 Democratic nominee for congress or their designee shall serve as the temporary chair and shall convene and preside over the district caucus at the State Convention until a permanent chair is elected by the caucus. In the event that the nominee is not present at the caucus at the hour for which it is called, their place as temporary chair shall be filled by the county chair from the county in the district having the largest number of votes at the last general election. The temporary chair shall designate a temporary secretary to serve until a permanent secretary is elected by the caucus.
 - b. The order of business shall include the following:
 - i. Credentials Report
 - ii. Rules Report
 - iii. Election of one (1) Chair, one (1) Vice Chair, one (1) Secretary, one (1) Treasurer of the District
 - iv. Election of fifteen (15) members of the District Committee
 - v. Election of delegates and alternates to the Michigan Democratic State Central Committee (15 Delegates and 15 Alternates, 8 Male Delegates, 7 Female Delegates, 7 Male Alternates, 8 Female Delegates)
 - vi. Hearing from candidates for office
 - vii. Additional business that is deemed proper and necessary
 - c. District caucuses shall adjourn by 2:30 PM. Caucuses may only continue after 2:30 PM to complete the elections required by the order of business above.

II. Rules

- A. Proceedings of the Convention shall be conducted according to the Rules of the Michigan Democratic Party, the Call to Convention, these Rules, and Robert's Rules of Order, newly revised, unless otherwise provided.
- B. In order to vote in person at the state convention or during a caucus, a person must have been issued a delegate credential in accordance with the eligibility standards outlined in the Official Call to Convention. C. The Chair of the Caucus shall be allowed to exercise discretion in presenting Democrats to address the Caucus.
- D. Candidates for office seeking to address the caucus may have up to 3 three minutes to speak. E. The Chair shall have authority to reject consideration of a motion that is deemed improper or dilatory. A motion shall be considered improper when it conflicts with the DNC Charter, MDP Rules, or an action previously taken by the Democratic Party.
- F. Actions to approve the Credential Report and Rules Report shall require a simple majority. G. Weighted voting shall be used in District Caucuses to ensure proper distribution of the State Allocation of Delegate Votes (SADV) in accordance with Section 4 of the Rules for Voting and Elections in the Michigan Democratic Party.

- H. Single-position offices including Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, and Treasurer will be elected individually. I. Eligibility and voting procedures at Caucus:
 - 1. In order to vote as a delegate at the Caucus, a person other than a precinct delegate, Democratic elected official, or Democratic nominee to partisan office must be a member of the Michigan Democratic Party for at least thirty (30) days prior to April 11, 2024. Precinct delegates, Democratic elected officials, and Democratic nominees to partisan office must be a member of the Michigan Democratic Party on April 11, 2024 and may become members that day when they receive their credentials.
 - 2. No proxies may be used.
 - 3. The unit rule, or any rules or practice whereby all members of a party unit, delegation or caucus may be required to cast their votes in accordance with the will of a majority of the body, shall not be permitted.
 - 4. Voice votes shall be permitted on the floor of caucus and may be used to address caucus business properly brought before the body.
 - 5. If a voice vote is inconclusive or improper under the circumstances, a hand vote shall be used except where a roll call is properly requested or required.
 - 6. Where proportional voting is applicable, the caucus shall conduct a hand vote and may be reported as the actual vote to the Caucus Chair who shall then compute the proportionate vote on the question, or may be reported as the already computed proportional vote.
 - 7. Slate voting shall be used in the election of the District Committee and State Central Committee in accordance with Section 6.4 of the Rules for Voting and Elections in the Michigan Democratic Party. A slate may consist of one person up to the number of positions to be elected.
 - 8. A majority of the weighted delegate vote shall be required to win a single position office such as Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer or Secretary.
 - 9. A member who is seeking election does not need to be in attendance.
